YOUR QUALIFICATIONS

To join the Hiscox Graduate Scheme UK applicants will need a 2.1 degree with 300 UCAS points in your A2 exams, excluding general studies; US applicants will need a degree of 3.4 out of 4 from a US university. In most cases we accept a good degree in any discipline but a high standard of numeracy and interpersonal skills are required for every role in Hiscox.

GRADUATE ROLES AVAILABLE AT HISCOX

TRAINEE ACTUARY

You will use your numerical background and statistical techniques to help analyse the impact of future events on Hiscox. You will become an expert in risk management, assessing the uncertainty surrounding the cost and timing of future insurance claims payments.

TRAINEE BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT ANALYST

You will drive change and operational excellence throughout our business to ensure a streamlined and cost effective operating model. Our successful growth depends on fulfilling our vision of an efficient and responsive operations model which underpins our position as a market leading specialist insurer.

TRAINEE CLAIMS HANDLER

You will develop the technical skills needed to deal with complex claims while learning about the pricing of risk and responding to underwriters around claims trends and risk management issues.

TRAINEE RISK MODELLER

You will be responsible for researching risks posed by catastrophes created by natural hazards such as hurricanes and earthquakes, through to man made catastrophes such as global terrorism. Strong levels of numeracy and the ability to summarise complex information are essential.

You will analyse and price risks; building relationships with brokers and clients. You will need a technical mind to understand risk, the commercial awareness to develop new business and the speed of thought to negotiate with brokers.


I had already seen Hiscox from the inside having completed a ten week summer internship in 2008 and liked what I saw, so applying for the Graduate Scheme made perfect sense.

WORK OVERSEAS

The chance to prove myself from an early stage has been very satisfying. I have already found myself presenting to Hiscox's Group Head of Claims on a major claim – it's daunting, but the chance to impress at the highest levels of the company comes very early at Hiscox.

The Graduate Scheme itself has already provided a great foundation to my Hiscox career. I have been on an external secondment to a law firm (a good experience, but made me realise I had chosen the right career) and am looking forward to completing all my rotations within Hiscox, which will also include a three month international placement in Europe or the US.
